Dear Parents/Guardians,

Well the snow sure keeps on coming! I appreciate everyone being cautious and patient with morning drop off and afternoon pick up. We realize it is challenging with less spots to park in. We appreciate everyone working together on. Last week our custodians worked hard shoveling the roof and getting the building safe for everyone. Write your child's name and the name of the book he/she read on the bear and return the bear to your child's teacher. We would love it if your child would also decorate the bear. The bears will be displayed all around our school and we hope to get enough bears to reach from Mr. Raiche's office to Mrs. Campbell's office by the end of March. Your child will get more bears from his/her teacher once they bring in their first bear. This is a month long on-going school activity.

"iCARE" or **Introducing Children to Acceptance through Reading and Education** is a program that works proactively to help explain why some classmates might be different than others. iCARE utilizes story time to create a friendly, safe environment where thoughtful questions can be asked and answered. To facilitate classroom discussion, reading volunteers are provided with story-specific question and answer cards relating to each book. This reading program has community members
