#### MODULAR BUILDING DEMOLITION PLAINVILLE, MASSACHUSETTS

The Town of Plainville, Massachusetts invites lump sum proposals from qualified from Contractors for the Demolition of Modular Building and Connector, and related Work.

The work includes but is not limited to the complete demolition and lawful disposal of the entirety of the modular building, building connector (except for a portion of the floor slab), removal of all piers, footings, adjustment of the elevation of capped utilities within the limits of work, limited repairs to adjacent building, scheduled to remain, at Connector, import dirt fill, grading and associated work. The estimated cost of the work is under \$50,000.

<u>Sealed General Bids</u> for this project will be accepted from eligible bidders until **1:00 P.M.**, **Thursday, December 5, 2024,** and will be publicly opened, forthwith in the Superintendent's Conference Room 68 Messenger Street, Plainville, MA 02762. General bidders must be certified by DCAMM pursuant to M.G.L.c. 149 Section 44D. The General Bidder must be certified eligible in the DCAMM Prime/General category of <u>DEMOLITION</u>.

A pre-bid conference will be held for all interested parties on-site on **Thursday, November 21**, **2024, at 11:00 A.M.** at Modular Classroom Building located at 68 Messenger Street, Plainville, MA 02762. Attendance at this pre-bid conference is not mandatory but is recommended for parties submitting a bid.

General bids shall be accompanied by a bid deposit in the form of a bid bond, or cash, or certified check, or treasurer's/cashier's check issued by a responsible bank or trust company, payable to the Town of Plainville in the amount of five percent (5%) of value of the bid. Bid deposits will be dealt with as provided in Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 149, Section 44B.

To be given consideration, all general bids must be accompanied by a copy of the Bidder's Certificate of Eligibility and an Update Statement. The General Bidder must be certified eligible in the DCAMM Prime/General category of **DEMOLITION**.

Bids shall be made on the basis of the Minimum Wage Rates as determined by the Commissioner of Labor and Industries, Pursuant to the Provisions of Chapter 149, Sections 26 to 27D inclusive of Massachusetts General Laws, a copy of which is attached to and is made a part of the Contract.

#### PART 1 - GENERAL

#### 1.01 SCHEDULE OF DATES

- C. <u>Pre-bid walk-thru</u> Thursday November 21, 2024, at 11:00 A.M. at Modular Classroom Building located at 68 Messenger Street, Plainville, MA 02762. Attendance at this pre-bid conference is not mandatory but is recommended for parties submitting a bid. All questions and requests for interpretations must be submitted in writing by the General Bidders until 1:00 P.M., Wednesday November 27, 2024.
- F. Addenda will be issued with interpretations as determined by the Owner.

#### 1.02 BIDDING PROCEDURE

- A. Bids for the work are subject to the provisions of General Laws, Chapter 149, Sections 44A-44L inclusive, as amended. Regulations governing the bidding procedures as set forth in the above mentioned amended General Laws must be followed.
- B. In the event of any inconsistencies between any of the provisions of these Contract Documents and of the cited statute, anything herein to the contrary notwithstanding, the provisions of the said statute shall control.
- C. No General Bid received by the Awarding Authority after the time respectively established herein for the opening of General Bids will be considered, regardless of the cause for the delay in the receipt of any such bid.

#### 1.03 WITHDRAWAL OF BIDS

A. Bids may be withdrawn prior to the time respectively established for the opening of General Bids only on written request to the Awarding Authority.

### 1.04 INTERPRETATION OF CONTRACT DOCUMENTS

- A. No oral interpretation will be made to any bidder. All questions or requests for interpretations must be made in writing to the Architect.
- B. Every interpretation made to a bidder will be in the form of an Addendum, to the drawings and/or specifications, which will be made available to all persons to whom Contract Documents have been issued.
- C. Failure of the Awarding Authority to send, or of any bidder to receive any such addendum shall not relieve any bidder form obligation under his bid as submitted.
- D. All such addenda shall become a part of the Contract Documents.

### 1.05 EXAMINATION OF SITE AND CONTRACT DOCUMENTS

- A. Each bidder shall visit the site of the proposed work and fully acquaint himself with conditions as they exist and shall also thoroughly examine the Contract Documents. Failure of any bidder to visit the site and acquaint himself with the Contract Documents shall not relieve any bidder from any obligation with respect to his bid.
- B. By submitting a bid, the bidder agrees that the Contract Documents are adequate and that the required result can be produced. The successful bidder shall furnish any and all labor, materials, insurance, permits and all other items needed to produce the required result to the satisfaction of the Awarding Authority.

### 1.06 BID SECURITY

- A. The General Contractor's bid must be accompanied by bid security in the amount of five percent (5%) of the bid.
- B. At the option of the bidder, the security may be bid bond, cash, certified, treasurer's or cashier's check issued by a responsible bank or trust company. No other type of bid security is acceptable.

Bid Bonds shall be issued by a Surety Company qualified to do business under the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

C. Certified, Treasurer's or Cashier's check shall be made payable to the Town of Plainville, MA.

- D. The bid security shall secure the execution of the Contract and the furnishing of a Performance and Payment Bond by the successful General Bidder.
- E. Should any General Bidder to whom an award is made fail to enter into a contract therefore within five (5) days, Saturdays, Sundays and Legal Holidays, excluded, after notice of award has been mailed to him or fail within such time to furnish a Performance Bond and also a Labor and Materials or Payment Bond as required, the amount so received from such General Bidder through his Bid Bond, Cash, Certified, Treasurer's or Cashier's check as bid deposit shall become the property of the Town of Plainville, Massachusetts as liquidated damages; provided that, the amount of the bid deposit which becomes the property of the Town of Plainville, Massachusett exceed the difference between his bid price and the bid price of the next lowest responsible and eligible bidder; and provided further that, in case of death, disability, bona fide clerical error or mechanical error of a substantial nature, or other unforeseen circumstances affecting the General Bidder, his deposit shall be returned to him.

#### 1.07 BID FORM

- A. General Bids shall be submitted on the "FORM FOR GENERAL BID" enclosed. Erasures or other changes must be explained or noted over the signature of the bidder.
- B. File Sub-Bids, if applicable, shall be submitted on the "FORM FOR FILE SUB-BID" enclosed. Erasures or other changes must be explained or noted over the signature of the bidder.
- C. Bid forms must be completely filled in. Bids which are incomplete, conditional, or obscure, or which contain additions not called for will be rejected.
- D. General Bidders shall submit <u>one set</u> of executed bid forms to the Awarding Authority.

#### 1.08 SUBMISSION OF BIDS AND BID SECURITIES

A. Each bid submitted by a General Contractor shall be enclosed in a sealed envelope which shall be placed with the bid security in an outer envelope. The outer envelope shall be sealed and clearly marked as follows:

#### 1.09 AWARD OF CONTRACT

- A. The Contract shall be awarded to the lowest responsible and eligible General Bidder on the basis of competitive bids in accordance with the procedure set forth in the provision of Section 44B-44L inclusive, as amended or inserted, by Chapter 149 of the General Laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.
- B. If the bidder selected as the General Contractor fails to perform his agreement to execute a contract in accordance with the terms of his General Bid and furnish a Performance Bond and also a Labor and Materials or Payment Bond, as stated in his General Bid in accordance with Section 44F, an award shall be made to the next lowest responsible and eligible bidder.
- C. The words "lowest responsible and eligible bidder" shall be the bidder whose name is the lowest of those bidders possessing the skill, ability and integrity necessary to the faithful performance of the work and who shall certify that he is able to furnish labor that can work in harmony with all other elements of labor employed, or to be employed, on the work. Essential information in regard to such qualifications shall be submitted in such form as the Awarding Authority may require.
- D. Action on the award will be taken within thirty (30) days, Saturdays, Sundays and Legal Holidays excluded after the opening of the bids.

#### 1.10 SECURITY FOR FAITHFUL PERFORMANCE

A. The successful bidder must deliver to the Awarding Authority with their delivery of the executed contract, an executed Performance Bond, and also a Labor and Materials or Payment Bond, each of a surety company qualified to do business under the laws of the Commonwealth and satisfactory to the Awarding Authority and each in the sum of One Hundred Percent (100%) of the Contract Price, as surety for the faithful performance of his contract, and for the payment of all

persons performing labor or furnishing materials in connection therewith. Said bonds shall provide that, if the General Contractor fails or refuses to complete the Contract, the Surety Company will be obligated to do so.

B. Premiums are to be paid by the General Contractor and are to be included in the Contract Price.

- 1.14 EQUALITY
  - A. Except where otherwise specifically provided to the contrary, the words "or equal" are hereby inserted immediately following the name or description of each article, assembly, system, or any component part thereof, in the Contract Documents. It is the contractor's responsibility to provide all the research and documentation that would prove a product or assembly is "equal". Failure to provide research or documentation does not alleviate the contractor's responsibility to meet the schedule.

#### 1.15 TAX EXEMPT NUMBER

A. The Town of Plainville, MA. will provide the successful respondent with their tax certificate confirming their tax-exempt status.

#### 1.16 SCHEDULE

- A. All on-site Work shall be performed and completed during the February 2025 School Vacation - Monday February 17, 2025, through Friday February 21, 2025.
   Alternate date for on-site Work, if mutually agreed by Contractor and Owner is during the April School Vacation – April 21, 2025, through April 25, 2025.
- B. The Contractor is advised that there will be no exceptions made nor allowed if the contractor fails to properly plan and execute the scope of work. Late fees will be imposed if the Demolition and associated Work is not completed by April 26, 2025.

#### 1.17 LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

A. The attention of all general bidders is directed to the fact that the Contract Documents provide for the assessment of liquidated damages in the event that the General Contractor fails to achieve substantial completion of the Project within the time specified by the Contract Liquidated damages shall be in the amount of One thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) per day.

#### 1.18 ON-SITE PROJECT JOB MEETINGS

A. There will be a daily on-site Project coordination meeting between the Contractor and the Owner's designated representative(s) to discuss progress and to answer questions. The Contractor's Superintendent and Project Manager shall attend each meeting.

#### 1.19 PROJECT SUPERINTENDENT

A. The Contractor shall provide the same person as Superintendent for the entire duration of the project.

#### 1.20 AWARD

A. The awarding authority reserves the right to reject any or all bids, if it be in the public interest to do so, and to act upon the bids and make its award in any lawful manner.

#### 1.21 MINIMUM WAGE SCHEDULE

- A. Bids shall be made on the basis of the Minimum Wage Schedule, as determined by the Commissioner of Labor and Industries, pursuant to the provision of Chapter 149, Section 26 to 27D inclusive, of the Massachusetts General Laws.
- B. All Bids shall be accompanied by the Bidder's Certification regarding payment of prevailing wage rates on the form included with the Form for General Bid.

#### 1.22 CONFLICT OF INTEREST

A. A bidder filing a proposal thereby certifies that the proposal is made in good faith, without fraud, collusion, or connection of any kind with any other bidder for the same work, and that the bidder is completing solely on its own behalf without connection with, or obligation to, any undisclosed person or firm.

#### 1.23 NOTICE TO PROCEED

A. No bidder is to proceed without a formal notice to proceed as set out in the contract.

#### 1.24 STAGING

- A. The General Contractor shall provide all vertical access (which includes staging, vertical lifts, etc.) and hoisting, if applicable, for all work within the Contract. General Contractor will provide complete coverage of all wall areas receiving work and shall provide full decks and complete access for File Sub- Bidders (if applicable), subcontractors (if applicable), as well as the Owner's Agent(s).
- B. Access is included in the base contract. Access shall be granted to the Owner's Agent(s) at any time.

#### 1.25 CONSTRUCTION BARRICADES / DURING DEMOLITION AND POST DEMOLITION

- A. The General Contractor shall provide all barricades to enclose the work area to prevent unauthorized access to the site.
  - 1. The barricades shall provide enough room for <u>all</u> construction/demolition activities to be performed while separated from pedestrians, visitors, and staff on site.
  - 2. Safety is the sole responsibility of the Contractor and any barricades necessary to protect the work and the public shall be provided.
  - 3. Provide entrance tunnel protection as may be required.
  - 4. At the conclusion of Demolition activities and required site work, Contractor shall leave all erosion control measures in place and erect a perimeter snow fence around the site leaving egress openings from existing school across the concrete landing and down both asphalt walkways.

#### 1.26 INSURANCE

A. The contractor shall purchase and maintain, at his expense all insurance required by the Contract. Documents and all insurance required by the applicable laws of Massachusetts, including but not limited to, General Laws, Chapter 146, in connection with all hoisting/crane equipment.

- B. The Contractor shall purchase and maintain such insurance as will protect him from claims under workmen's compensation acts and from claims for damages because of bodily injury, including death and all property damage including, without limitation, damage to buildings and adjoining the site of construction which might arise from and during operations under this contract, whether such operations be by himself or by any subcontractor or anyone directly or indirectly employed by either of them including:
  - 1. Statutory Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability

The contractor shall provide insurance for the payment of compensation and the furnishing of other benefits under Chapter 152 of the General Laws (so-called Worker's Compensation Act) to all persons to be employed under this contract and shall continue in force such insurance as aforesaid shall be deemed a material breach of this Contract and shall operate as an immediate termination thereof. The contractor shall, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, conform to the provisions of Section 34A of Chapter 149 of the General Laws, which Section is incorporated herein by reference and made a part of hereof.

2. Comprehensive General Liability Insurance

Minimum bodily injury limits of \$1,000,000 per person and \$3,000,000 per accident, and property damage limits of \$1,000,000 per accident and \$3,000,000 aggregate during any 12-month period, shall include the following:

- a. Public liability (bodily injury and property damage)
- b. X.C.U. (explosion, collapse, and underground utilities)
- c. Independent contractor's protective liability.
- d. Products and completed operations.
- e. Save harmless agreement for Owner and Owners Representatives.
- 3. Comprehensive All Risk Motor Vehicle Liability Insurance

Minimum bodily injury limits of \$ 1,000,000 per person, \$ 1,000,000 per accident, and property damage limit of \$ 1,000,000 per accident.

4. All Risk Insurance

Covering all Contractor's equipment with a provision for Waiver of Subrogation against the Owner.

- 5. Umbrella Liability Insurance in Umbrella Form with combined Bodily Injury and Property Damage Limit of \$2,000,000.
- 6. The <u>Town of Plainville and Port Construction Consulting</u> shall be named as additional insured on Contractor's General Liability, Automobile Liability, and Umbrella Liability policies, with a <u>Waiver of Subrogation</u> on the insurance policy for this project.

#### 1.27 SITE ACCESS

- A. The General Contractor shall gain access to the site via routes approved by the Owner.
  - 1. The General Contractor as part of the bid price will restore all roads, curbs, driveways, walks and grassed or landscaped or any other areas damaged during their activities.

#### 1.28 CONSTRUCTION / DEMOLITION EQUIPMENT

- A. The General Contractor shall prepare a site logistics plan and locate all construction/demolition equipment at locations pre-approved by the Owner.
- B. The General Contractor shall locate all equipment, tools, and materials for the prosecution of the Work within the approved and enclosed area designated within the approved site logistics plan.

#### 1.29 BUILDING / DEMOLITION PERMIT FEES

A. All Building / Demolition permit fees will be waived for this project. However, the General Contractor and any required sub-contractors must obtain permits as required.

### 1.30 EQUAL OPPORTUNITY

A. The Town of Plainville, MA is an equal opportunity employer.

### 1.31 ALTERNATES – ALTERNATE NO. 1

A. In the event that winter weather conditions prevent Contractor performance and completion of the Work during the February School vacation week (2/17/25 through 2/21/25) and the secondary date range during April School vacation week (4/21/25 through 4/25/25) is required; provide Alternate price to remove erosion control measures, omit snow fence installation (see 00 21 13 item 1.25 above), finish grade the Work area, and provide loam and seed.

#### 1.32 COMPLETE BID FORMS

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#### Information about Prevailing Wage Schedules for Awarding Authorities and Contractors

• The wage rates will remain in effect for the duration of the project, except in the case of multi-year public construction projects. For construction projects lasting longer than one year, awarding authorities must request an updated wage schedule no later than two weeks before the anniversary of the date the contract was executed by the awarding authority and the general contractor. For multi-year CM AT RISK projects, the awarding authority must request an annual update no later than two weeks before the anniversary date, determined as the earlier of: (a) the execution date of the GMP Amendment, or (b) the execution date of the first amendment to permit procurement of construction services. The updated wage schedule must be provided to all contractors, including general and sub-contractors, working on the construction project.

• This annual update requirement is generally not applicable to 27F "rental of equipment" contracts. For such contracts, the prevailing wage rates issued by DLS shall remain in effect for the duration of the contract term. However, if the prevailing wage rate sheet issued does not contain wage rates for each year covered by the contract term, the Awarding Authority must request updated rate sheets from DLS and provide them to the contractor to ensure the correct rates are being paid throughout the duration of the contract. Additionally, if an Awarding Authority exercises an option to renew or extend the contract term, they must request updated rate sheet to the contractor.

• This wage schedule applies only to the specific project referenced at the top of this page and uniquely identified by the "Wage Request Number" on all pages of this schedule.

• An Awarding Authority must request an updated wage schedule if it has not opened bids or selected a contractor within90 days of the date of issuance of the wage schedule. For CM AT RISK projects (bid pursuant to G.L. c.149A), the earlier of: (a) the execution date of the GMP Amendment, or (b) the bid for the first construction scope of work must be within 90-days of the wage schedule issuance date.

• The wage schedule shall be incorporated in any advertisement or call for bids for the project as required by M.G.L. c. 149, § 27. The wage schedule shall be made a part of the contract awarded for the project. The wage schedule must be posted in a conspicuous place at the work site for the life of the project in accordance with M.G.L. c. 149 § 27. The wages listed on the wage schedule must be paid to employees performing construction work on the project whether they are employed by the prime contractor, a filed sub-bidder, or a sub-contractor.

• Apprentices working on the project are required to be registered with the Massachusetts Division of Apprentice Standards (DAS). Apprentices must keep their apprentice identification card on their persons during all work hours on the project. An apprentice registered with DAS may be paid the lower apprentice wage rate at the applicable step as provided on the prevailing wage schedule. **Any apprentice not registered with DAS regardless of whether they are registered with another federal, state, local, or private agency must be paid the journeyworker's rate.** 

• Every contractor or subcontractor working on the construction project must submit weekly payroll reports and a Statement of Compliance directly to the awarding authority by mail or email and keep them on file for three years. Each weekly payroll report must contain: the employee's name, address, occupational classification, hours worked, and wages paid. Do not submit weekly payroll reports to DLS. For a sample payroll reporting form go to http://www.mass.gov/dols/pw.

• Contractors with questions about the wage rates or classifications included on the wage schedule have an affirmative obligation to inquire with DLS at (617) 626-6953.

• Contractors must obtain the wage schedules from awarding authorities. Failure of a contractor or subcontractor to pay the prevailing wage rates listed on the wage schedule to all employees who perform construction work on the project is a violation of the law and subjects the contractor or subcontractor to civil and criminal penalties.

• Employees not receiving the prevailing wage rate set forth on the wage schedule may file a complaint with the Fair Labor Division of the office of the Attorney General at (617) 727-3465.

## **CONTRACT**

WITNESSETH: That for and in consideration of the payments and agreements hereinafter mentioned, the Town of Plainville and the Contractor hereby agree as follows:

### 1. SCOPE OF SERVICES

In consideration of the obligations herein contained, the Contractor shall provide Demolition of Modular Building and Connector, Selective Demolition, and related work as identified within the Project Manual and Drawings at 68 Messenger Street, Plainville, MA 02762 for the stipulated Lump Sum amount: \_\_\_\_\_\_(in words) \$\_\_\_\_\_\_ as set forth in the Request for Bid dated November 13, 2024, incorporated by reference. In the event of any conflict among the following Contract Documents, the Documents shall be construed according to the following priorities:

Highest Priority:	Amendments to Contract (if any)
Second Priority:	Contract
Third Priority:	Addenda to Request for Bids (if any)
Fourth Priority:	Request for Bid
Fifth Priority:	Contractor's Bid

### 2. CHANGES IN THE WORK

Changes in the Work may be accomplished after execution of the contract, and without invalidating the Contract only by a Change Order, which shall be based upon agreement by the Owner and the Contractor.

Changes in the Work shall be performed under applicable provisions of the Contract Documents and the Contractor shall proceed promptly, unless otherwise provided in the Change Order.

A Change Order is a written instrument prepared by the Owner and signed by the Owner and the Contractor stating their agreement upon all of the following:

- 1. The change in the Work;
- 2. The amount of the adjustment, if any, in the Contract Sum; and
- 3. The extent of the adjustment, if any, in the Contract Time.

### 3. TERM

The Contractor shall commence the work promptly upon execution of this agreement. Substantially completed by April 26, 2025 – see schedule in the Contract Documents.

## 4. PAYMENT

In consideration for performance of the work in accordance with the requirements of this Contract, and in accordance with **M.G.L. c. 30**, section **39M**, the Town shall pay the Contractor the prices set forth in the Contractor's Bid. All requests for payment shall be submitted to the Town as an invoice and shall specify work completed, progress made toward completing deliverables, the number of hours worked, the classification of each employee who performed work, and the billing rate for each employee who performed work on the project. Payment will be due thirty (30) days after receipt of the Contractor's invoice by the Town for services rendered in accordance with this Contract. The Town shall not make payments in advance.

### 4. WARRANTY

The Contractor shall furnish all supplies, equipment, and labor necessary for the performance of the services required by this Contract and warrants that it has in its employ, and throughout the term of the Contract, will continue to have a sufficient number of persons experienced in performing services required by this Contract, such that the Contractor's obligations under the Contract will be carried out in a prompt, safe and professional manner. Any equipment delivered shall be of generally merchantable quality and shall be fit for the purpose sought by the Town of Plainville. All manufacturers' warranties on any equipment delivered shall be assigned to the Town of Plainville.

### 5. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

The Contractor shall comply with all provisions of Federal, Massachusetts and Town of Plainville law applicable to his work including, without limitation, statutes, by-laws, rules, regulations, orders and directives, as amended, and including, without limitation, Chapter 30B, Chapter 30B, Sections 39F, 39G, 39K, 39L, 39M, 39N, 39O, 39P, and 39R of the Massachusetts General Laws, as amended, and Chapter 149, Sections 34, 34A, and 34B of the Massachusetts General Laws, as amended, as though such terms were set forth in their entirety herein.

## 6. INSURANCE

The Contractor shall provide and maintain throughout the term of the Contract and any extension or renewal thereof the following insurance with companies that are authorized and licensed in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to issue policies for the coverages and limits as listed in the Project Manual.

Contractor shall provide 100% Performance and Payment Bonds as listed in the Project Manual.

The above insurance policies shall also be subject to the following requirements:

- a) Each policy shall contain a thirty (30) day written notice of cancellation, change or non-renewal to the Town.
- b) Carriers must have an A.M. Best rating of A-VII or better
- c) Insurance Policy must cover the entire contract period.
- d) The description of operations/location/special items on certificate of insurance shall name the Town and Owners Agent as additional insureds for the purpose of this Bid and shall be filed with the Town Purchasing Assistant prior to commencement of the contract.
- e) All premium costs for Insurance and Bonds shall be borne by the Contractor.

## 7. INDEMNIFICATION

The Contractor shall compensate the Town of Plainville for all damage to Town property of any nature arising out of the Contractor's work. To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Contractor shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the Town of Plainville and all of its officers, employees, boards, commissions, committees, agents and representatives from and against all claims, causes of action, suits, costs, damages, and liability of any kind which arise out of the breach by the Contractor of its obligations under this Contract, or the act or omission of the Contractor, its subcontractors, or their officers, employees, agents and representatives or anyone directly or indirectly employed by them, or anyone for whose acts or omissions they may be liable, regarding the work to be performed by the Contractor under the Contract, or which arise out of the violation of any federal, Massachusetts or Town of Plainville statute, by-law, rule, regulation, order or directive, or which relate to personal injury or property damage suffered by the Contractor or any of its officers or employees regarding the subject matter of this Contract. Said costs shall include, without limitation, reasonable legal costs, collections fees, and counsel fees incurred in defending any claim or suit that may be brought against the Town and any judgment that may be obtained in any such claim or suit.

## 8. TERMINATION

- a. If the Contractor shall breach any provision of this Contract, which breach is not cured within twenty-one (21) days of written notice thereof from the Town to the Contractor, the Town shall have the right to terminate this Contract upon written notice to the Contractor.
- b. If any assignment shall be made by the Contractor or by any guarantor of the Contractor for the benefit of creditors, or if a petition is filed by the Contractor or by any guarantor of the Contractor for adjudication as a bankrupt, or for reorganization or an arrangement under any provision of the Bankruptcy Act as then in force and effect, or if an involuntary petition under any of the provisions of the Bankruptcy Act is filed against the Contractor and such involuntary petition is not discharged within ninety (90) days thereafter, in any event the Town may terminate this Contract upon written notice to the Contractor.
- c. The award of this Contract and the continued operation of this Contract are contingent upon sufficient money to fund the Contract. Should the Town of Plainville fail to secure necessary funds therefor, the Town of Plainville shall no longer be under any obligation to tender performance, including payment, under the terms of this Contract. In that event, the Town may terminate this Contract upon written notice to the Contractor.
- d. The Town may terminate this Contract upon written notice to the Contractor if a source of money to fund the Contract is lost during the Contract term. In the alternative, the parties may agree in writing to amend the Contract to provide for a Contract price, which represents a reduced appropriation for the Contract term.
- e. The Town may also terminate this Contract for convenience upon thirty (30) days' written notice to the Contractor.

In the event of termination, the Contractor shall be entitled to be paid for services rendered in accordance with this Contract prior to termination. In the event that this Contract is terminated pursuant to Section 8a. or 8b. above, the Town may make any reasonable purchase or contract to purchase services in substitution for services due from the Contractor and may deduct the cost of any substitute contract, or damages sustained by the Town due to non-performance or non-conformance of services together with incidental and consequential damages from the Contract price, and shall withhold such damages from sums due or sums which become due.

## 9. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Any action at law or suit in equity instituted by the Contractor as a result of the performance, non-performance or alleged breach of this Contract shall be filed in the Superior Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts for Norfolk County, MA, and in no other court or jurisdiction. No action or failure to act by the Town shall constitute a waiver of a right or duty afforded to the Town under the Contract, nor shall such action or failure to act constitute approval of or acquiescence in a breach thereunder, except as may be specifically agreed in writing. Prior to commencing services under this Contract, the Contractor shall furnish the Town, in writing, the names, addresses and telephone numbers of not fewer than two (2) principal employees of his business who are to be contacted in the event of an after-hours emergency. By entering into this Contract, the Contractor certifies under penalties of perjury that its entry into this Contract was submitted and made in good faith and without collusion or fraud with any person. As used in this certification, the word "person" shall mean any natural person, business, partnership, corporation, union, committee, club, or other organization, entity, or group of individuals. By entering into this Contract, the Contractor certifies under the penalties of perjury, pursuant to M.G.L. c.62C, Section 49A(b), that it has complied with all laws of the Commonwealth relating to taxes, to reporting of employees and contractors, and to withholding and remitting child support. The Contractor understands that the Massachusetts Conflict of Interest Law, Chapter 268A of the Massachusetts General Laws, applies to the Contractor with respect to the services required to be provided under this Contract. The Contractor shall provide services under this Contract as an independent contractor with the Town of Plainville and not as an employee of the Town of Plainville. No employee, agent or representative of the Contractor shall be entitled to receive any benefits of employment with the Town of Plainville, including without limitation salary, overtime, vacation pay, holiday pay, sick leave, health insurance, life insurance, pension or deferred compensation. To the extent permitted by law, the Town shall have the right to conduct a check of the Criminal Offender Record Information (CORI) maintained by the Massachusetts Criminal History Systems Board, and the Sex Offender Record Information (SORI) maintained by the Massachusetts Sex Offender Registry Board, for any officer or employee of the Contractor or of a subcontractor of the Contractor who will work on the project. The Contractor shall hereby acknowledge that the use of alcoholic beverages, narcotics, and mood-altering substances, except for current valid, legal prescriptions, by any officer, employee, agent, or representative of the Contractor is prohibited on Town of Plainville property, which is the subject matter of this Contract and during all hours of work under this Contract. Prevailing wage rates shall be paid, pursuant to M.G.L. c.149, §§26-27G, if they are applicable. The Contractor shall not discriminate against or exclude any person from participation herein on grounds specified in M.G.L. c. 151B. The Contractor shall not participate in or cooperate with an international boycott, as defined in Section 999 (b)(3) and (4) of the Internal Revenue Code, as amended, or engage in conduct declared to be unlawful by Section 2 of Chapter 151E of the Massachusetts General Laws. The Contractor shall not assign or subcontract in whole or in part this Contract or in any way transfer any interest in this Contract without the prior express written approval of the Town. This Contract may be amended only by written consent of the parties. This Contract constitutes the entire agreement of the parties and any other agreement, written or oral, that may exist is excluded

from this Contract. If any provision, or portion thereof, of this Contract shall be adjudged to be invalid or unenforceable by final judgment or order of a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions shall continue in effect to the extent permitted by law. The provisions of this Contract shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the heirs, assigns and successors in interest of the parties. This Contract shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, regardless of choice of law issues or principles. This Contract is executed as a sealed instrument. Except as otherwise provided in this Contract all notices required or permitted to be given hereunder shall be in writing and shall be delivered by certified mail or registered mail, return receipt requested, to the parties at the following address or such other address or addresses as to which a party shall have notified the other party in accordance with this Section.

Remove and dispose of all interior and exterior components of the connector building including but not limited to all piers, footings, roofing, siding, insulation, windows, doors, trim, closures, floor tile and all interior / exterior building except Contractor shall retain that portion of the concrete floor that extends to asphalt walkways at and adjacent to the connector building. The intent is to create an accessible path of travel from the egress doors in the existing building, scheduled to remain, across the concrete and down the walkways. All other connector concrete floor areas are to be sawcut, removed and disposed.
- 3. At the conclusion of demolition activities, the site shall be left flat with all erosion control and SWPPP measures left in place. Contractor shall install perimeter "snow fencing" on the exterior of the erosion control and SWPPP measures to limit access to all dirt areas. Contractor shall leave grade at 3" below adjacent paved roadways, parking lot and or walking surfaces and site shall be ready for loam and seed by others. If such unforeseen conditions result in additional expense, the Contractor shall not proceed without the written approval of the Owner.

The Contractor is cautioned to take all precautions and make all investigations necessary to install the proposed Work. The Owner will not consider unfamiliarity with the job conditions as a basis for additional compensation.

A. Any reference to "Architect", "Architect", "Owners Agent(s)" or "Consultant" in this Project Manual, Specification or on the drawings shall refer to Town of Plainville, MA and/or PORT Construction Consulting.

The Contractor bears full responsibility for providing any facility removed prior to Substantial Completion.
- B. Removal of all temporary facilities shall be a condition precedent to Substantial Completion unless directed otherwise by the Architect or specifically noted in the Specifications.
- C. The Contractor must comply with all safety laws and regulations of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, the United States Government, and local government agencies applicable to Work under this Contract. The Contractor's attention is directed to the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Department of Labor and Industries Regulation 454 CMR.
- E. Safety is the sole responsibility of the Contractor on the job site. Contractor is

notified that the building will be occupied during construction. The Architect does not have control of the job site in any way.

F. Space within the site for temporary facilities is very limited. Refer to the plans for contractor lay-down and storage areas. Contractor shall coordinate temporary facilities locations with the Owner during construction.

#### 1.03 TEMPORARY TELEPHONES

- A. The Contractor shall provide a telephone separate service or cell phone for the use of the Contractor's authorized personnel, Subcontractors, as well as the Architect and the Owner in the Field Office.
- B. The Contractor shall pay for the installation and removal of the foregoing temporary telephones or cell phone and for all calls and charges in connection therewith.
- C. No telephone service will be provided by the Owner.
- D. All telephone numbers shall be available to the project team. Provide pager for the project superintendent at the job site.
- E. Provide 24-hour emergency phone numbers for the Contractor's Project Manager and Superintendent.

#### 1.04 TEMPORARY TOILETS

- A. Portable, temporary toilets shall be provided by the Contractor and shall be located as directed by the Owner.
- B. The Contractor:
  - 1. Assumes full responsibility for the use of the temporarytoilets.
  - 2. Pays all costs for operation, maintenance and cleaning.
- C. Under no circumstances will the Contractor's personnel be allowed to use the existing toilets and sinks in the building.
- D. The Contractor shall not have use of sanitary toilet facilities within the building and must provide portable sanitary toilets for the use of their forces for the entire duration of the Work. Toilets shall be cleaned and emptied twice weekly (minimum) and as directed by the Owner.

#### 1.05 TEMPORARY CONSTRUCTION FENCE

A. The Contractor shall be responsible for providing and maintaining temporary

fencing and barricades around the construction as may be necessary to assure the safety of all persons authorized or unauthorized. Such protective measures shall also be located and constructed as required by local, state, and federal ordinances, laws, codes, or regulations.

#### 1.06 TEMPORARY STRUCTURES AND MATERIAL HANDLING

- A. The Contractor shall provide such secure storage sheds, temporary buildings, or trailers as required for the performance of the Contract.
- B. Materials shall be handled, stored, installed, cleaned, and protected in accordance with the best practice in the industry and, except where otherwise specified in the Contract Documents, in accordance with manufacturer's specifications and directions.
- C. The Contractor must obtain the permission of the Owner for the placement of any storage facilities on site, and the Owner assumes no responsibility for articles stored.

# 1.07 TEMPORARY STAGING, STAIRS, CHUTES

- A. The General Bidder must provide all of the following for the work:
  - 1. Except as otherwise specified, furnish, install, maintain in safe condition, and remove all scaffolds, staging, required for the use of all trades for proper execution of the Work, except as noted.
  - 2. Furnish, install, maintain in safe condition, and remove all temporary ramps, stairs, ladders, and similar items as required for the use of all trades for the proper execution of the Work.
  - 3. Furnish, install, maintain, and remove covered chutes from the Work area. Such shall be in convenient locations and permit disposal of rubbish directly into trucks or disposal units.
  - 4. Debris shall not be allowed to fall freely from any deck level to grade. Materials must be lowered, not thrown or dropped.
  - 5. Erect and maintain, in safe condition, all scaffolding or staging required on the job, as well as all hoisting, to perform all the Work in their scope and for use by the Architect who will need to review the Work or mark or verify quantities on the project.

#### 1.08 HOISTING FACILITIES

- A. The General Bidder must complete all of the following for the own work:
  - 1. Except as otherwise specified, provide, operate, and remove material hoists,

cranes, and other hoisting as required for the performance of the Work by all trades. All such hoisting service shall be without cost to the Subcontractors.

#### 1.09 UTILITIES

A. The Contractor will be able to use without charge, electrical power and water. It is the responsibility of the Contractor to make provisions to extend the utility from the nearest service outlet designated by the Owner to the point of use. Any misuse will be cause for discontinuance of the utility whereupon the Contractor shall provide the service at his/her own expense. Electrical energy shall not be used for temporary heating purposes. Do not include any cost for use of electric power or water that may be supplied by the Owner in the Basic Construction Proposal. All Work shall comply with all applicable codes as well as OSHA requirements.

#### 1.10 TEMPORARY WATER

- A. The Contractor may make use of the available water supply at the site for construction purposes, provided the permission of the Owner is obtained beforehand and only as long as the water is not used wastefully.
- B. The Contractor shall provide all necessary piping and hoses to utilize the available sources of water.
- C. The Contractor shall provide an adequate supply of cool drinking water with individual drinking cups for personnel on the job.

#### 1.11 TEMPORARY ELECTRICITY

- A. The Contractor may make use of the electricity available at the site, metered and paid for by the Owner, provided that the Contractor shall supply proper adapters and extension cords.
  - 1. Where heavy duty electric equipment drawing current in excess of 15 amperes is involved, the Contractor shall provide temporary service to supply the power.
  - 2. The temporary electric service shall include, but not be limited to labor, materials, and equipment necessary to supply temporary power of adequate capacity for the project.
  - 3. Transformers and meters, when required by the power company, will be furnished by the power company and the Contractor shall pay the costs thereof.

- B. Temporary electrical Work shall be performed under the direct supervision of at least one master electrician, who will be present on the project at all times when such Work is being performed.
- C. The Contractor shall furnish, install, and maintain lamps in operating condition. The Contractor, and each Subcontractor, shall furnish their own extension cords and additional lamps as may be required for their Work. Temporary Work of a special nature, not otherwise specified hereunder, shall be provided, maintained, and paid for the trade requiring same.
- D. All lamps installed in permanent lighting fixtures and used as temporary lights during the construction period shall be removed and replaced shortly before Substantial Completion by the set of lamps required to be provided under the Electrical Section of the Specifications.
- E. All temporary Work shall be provided in conformity with the National Electric Code, State laws, and requirements of the power company. Particular attention is called to Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Department of Labor and Industries Regulation, 454 CMR.

# 1.12 WEATHER PROTECTION

- A. The Contractor shall provide temporary enclosures and heat to permit Work to be carried on during the months of November through March in compliance with MGL c.149 §44G (d). Without limitation this includes such items as excavation, pile driving, steel erection, erection of certain exterior wall panels, masonry, sealants, waterproofing, sheet metal Work, roofing, and similar operations.
- B. "Weather Protection" means the temporary protection of that Work adversely affected by moisture, wind, and cold by covering, enclosing, and/or heating. This protection shall provide adequate working areas during the months of November through March as determined by the Owner and consistent with the construction schedule to permit the continuous progress of all Work necessary to maintain an orderly and efficient sequence of construction operations. The Contractor shall furnish and install "Weather Protection" material and be responsible for all costs, including heating required to maintain a minimum of 40 degrees F at the working surface. This provision does not supersede any specific requirements for methods of construction, curing of materials, or the applicable conditions set forth in the Contractor.
- C. Within 30 calendar days after award of the Contract, the Contractor shall submit in writing, to the Architect for approval, three (3) copies of the proposed methods for "Weather Protection".

- D. The Contractor shall assume the entire responsibility for weather protection during construction (until Substantial Completion), and shall be liable for any damage to any Work caused by failure to supply proper weather protection and proper ventilation.
- E. Work damaged by frost shall be removed and replaced by and at the Contractor's expense and as directed by the Architect.
- F. It is to be specifically understood that the Contractor shall do no Work under any conditions deemed unsuitable by the Contractor to the execution of the Work. This provision shall not constitute any waiver, release, or lessening of the Contractor's obligation to bring the Work to Substantial Completion within the period of time set forth in the Contract Documents.

# 1.13 PROTECTION

- A. Weather protection shall be provided for; weather conditions occurring or anticipated, the extent of the existing structure exposed, or any other possible hazard. Remove only as much roofing and sealant as can be completely replaced and made watertight in one day.
- B. Dust control, pedestrian protection, and traffic control measures shall be provided during the course of the Work.
- C. Schedule and execute all Work without exposing the sensitive building areas to the effects of inclement weather. Protect the existing structure and its contents against all risks, and repair or replace all damage to the Owner's satisfaction. Protect all exterior building surfaces, lighting, landscape areas, and pavement from damage.
- D. All new and temporary construction, including equipment and accessories, shall be secured from wind damage or blow-off.
- E. The Contractor shall provide all necessary temporary protection and barriers to segregate the Work area and to prevent damage to adjacent areas. Areas damaged because of inadequate protection will be repaired at no additional cost to the Owner, as per these specifications and the recommendations of the Architect.
- F. Provide temporary barricades and other forms of protection as required to protect Owner's personnel, residents, and general public from injury due to the Work.
- G. Any additional deteriorated concrete areas which are discovered shall be promptly reported to the Architect.
- H. Safety on the job site is the sole responsibility of the Contractor. The Contractor shall ensure that all Local, State, Federal, OSHA or other applicable safety

requirements are strictly accorded to. All OSHA safety requirements regarding items such as scaffolding, temporary protections, lift trucks, cranes, removal of debris, dust control, cleaning solvents, and high-pressure water washing, sandblasting and equipment shall be ensured by the Contractor.

#### 1.14 DEBRIS

- A. The Contractor will be responsible for the removal of all construction debris from the job site.
- B. Upon completion of each day and each phase of the Work the Contractor shall leave the premises free of all debris and waste, in broom-clean condition. Overnight storage of material on site will be as approved by the Owner. The Contractor shall be responsible for keeping the site free of rubbish and debris, and in a neat and orderly condition at all times. The Contractor shall clean up and remove all accumulated rubbish and debris daily.

#### 1.15 TEMPORARY NOISE AND POLLUTION CONTROL

#### 1.03 TEMPORARY PROTECTION

- A. The Contractor shall:
  - 1. Protect excavations, trenches, buildings, and materials at all times from rain water, ground water, backing-up, or leakage of sewers, drains, or other piping, or from water damage of any origin. Provide all pumps, piping, coverings, and other materials and equipment as required by job conditions to accomplish this requirement.
  - 2. In addition to the weather protection during the months of November to March specified elsewhere, provide temporary watertight enclosures for openings in exterior walls and in roof decks when and as required to protect the Work from damage by inclement weather.   - 5. Protect decks and slabs to receive Work by other trades from any soiling which will prevent proper adhesion of subsequent Work. Decks and slabs shall be left clean and free of blemishes at the time other trades begin the application of their Work.
  - 6. Protect concrete slabs to remain exposed and finished floors against mechanical damage, plaster droppings, oil, grease, paint, or other material which will stain the floor finish. Install and maintain adequate strips of building paper or other protection on finished floors in rooms where future Work will be done by other trades.
  - 7. Protect all surfaces to receive Work by other trades from any soiling which will prevent proper execution of subsequent Work.
  - 8. Protect other areas, furniture, and private property of the resident and the Owner. Any areas damaged by the Contractor shall be restored to the original condition or compensated at the Contractor's expense.
- B. Newly constructed and waterproofed surfaces shall not be subjected to traffic nor shall they be used for storage of materials. Where some activity must take place in order to carry out the Work, adequate protection must be provided.

# PROTECTION 01 51 00 - 2

C. After the installation of the Work by any Subcontractor is completed, the Contractor shall be responsible for its protection and for repairing, replacing, or cleaning any such Work which has been damaged by other trades or by any other cause, so that all Work is in first class condition at the time of Substantial Completion.

#### 1.04 ACCESS

- A. The Contractor shall, at all times, leave an unobstructed way along walks and roadways, and shall maintain barriers and lights for the protection of all persons and property in all locations where materials are stored or Work is in progress.

- 4. Water shall be potable and free of injurious contaminates.
- 5. No admixtures of any type will be permitted.
- C. Cleaning Agent: Detergent, solvent cleaner, non-acid solution type: as manufactured by Prosoco, Sure Klean, or equal.

#### PART 3 - EXECUTION

#### 3.01 MASONRY CONSTRUCTION, GENERAL

A. Masonry Work shall be done by skilled workmen, fully instructed as to the requirements of this specification, and adequately supervised during the Work.

- B. Cold Weather Masonry:

- C. Fastener Head Cover Material: Latex filler.

#### PART 3 EXECUTION

#### 3.01 EXAMINATION

- A. Do not begin application of coatings until substrates have been properly prepared.
- B. Verify that surfaces are ready to receive work as instructed by the product manufacturer.
- C. Examine surfaces scheduled to be finished prior to commencement of work. Report any condition that may potentially affect proper application.

#### 3.02 PREPARATION

- A. Clean surfaces thoroughly and correct defects prior to coating application.
- B. Prepare surfaces using the methods recommended by the manufacturer for achieving the best result for the substrate under the project conditions.
- C. Remove or mask surface appurtenances, including electrical plates, hardware, light fixture trim, escutcheons, and fittings, prior to preparing surfaces or finishing.
- D. Seal surfaces that might cause bleed through or staining of topcoat.
- E. Remove mildew from impervious surfaces by scrubbing with solution of tetrasodium phosphate and bleach. Rinse with clean water and allow surface to dry.

#### 3.03 APPLICATION

- A. Apply products in accordance with manufacturer's instructions.
- B. Do not apply finishes to surfaces that are not dry. Allow applied coats to dry before next coat is applied.
- C. Apply each coat to uniform appearance.
- D. Dark Colors and Deep Clear Colors: Regardless of number of coats specified, apply as many coats as necessary for complete hide.
- E. Sand wood and metal surfaces lightly between coats to achieve required finish.
- F. Vacuum clean surfaces of loose particles. Use tack cloth to remove dust and particles just prior to applying next coat.

#### 3.04 FIELD QUALITY CONTROL

- A. See Section 01 40 00 Quality Requirements, for general requirements for field inspection.
- B. Inspect and test questionable coated areas.
