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Dear Plainville Community Members,

In the spring of 2024, the Plainville Public Schools began the process of developing a long-term district strategy, resulting in a comprehensive strategic plan that will guide our work for the next four years. Using a "Planning for Success" model, our strategic planning committee benefited from the guidance of Dr. Ruth Gilbert-Whitner, a retired superintendent who facilitates strategic planning for schools statewide. Plainville's strategic planning committee included 17 members, representing Plainville's educators, administrators, parents, and school committee; this team demonstrated a seriousness of purpose and an overarching commitment to the success of the Plainville Public Schools.

In total, the full planning committee and the smaller administrative leadership team participated in nine dedicated working sessions. We began by assessing the status of the goals that framed the 2023-2024 school year, and then we engaged in a process called "Envisioning the Future," where we articulated our vision for the Plainville **Public Schools, focusing on** what we hope to accomplish by the year 2028. Our planning team reviewed myriad data points, allowing us to identify Plainville's strengths and areas where we have room for growth.

Working backwards from our vision for the future, we began identifying strategic objectives, action steps, and our anticipated measurable outcomes.

By doing so, the plan began to take shape with the emergence of five key areas that will help us achieve our vision for the Plainville Public Schools. These strategic objectives will focus on:

- 1 Enhancing our Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment Practices
- Meeting the Needs of All Learners Through a Tiered System of Supports
- Fostering a Community
 Focus on Climate, Culture,
 and Well-Being
- Offering High Quality
 Professional Development
- 5 Ensuring Efficiencies in All Areas of District Operations

By fortifying our efforts in these areas, we will continue to make forward progress towards our district's vision, which states: The Plainville Public Schools strive to provide high quality instruction in an environment where all students feel a sense of belonging. Plainville envisions a learning environment for all students where they are inspired to think critically, to solve problems, to accept themselves and others and to grow into responsible community members.







Critical to the success of our strategic plan is our ability to bring our goals to life over the next four years. Establish, and implement, and continue the use of standards-based programs (literacy/math) and investigate, identify, and implement standards-based programs for science/social studies to support an accessible cohesive, standards-based PK-6 curriculum with effective measures of student achievement.

- 1. By June 30, 2028, the Plainville Public Schools will have established and implemented an accessible cohesive, standards-based PK-6 curriculum with effective measures of student achievement using local and state measures.
- 2. By June 30, 2028, the district will have produced and implemented an updated, language-accessible report card that offers parents meaningful information regarding student progress.

Tiered Systems of Support

Maximize the success of all students through the development and implementation of an MTSS model that is adapted to the needs of Plainville.

Objective

1. By June 30, 2028, the Plainville Public Schools have maximized the success of all students through the development and implementation of an MTSS model as measured by improved student achievement in math, ELA, and science in the aggregate and in student cohorts.

2. By June 30, 2028, the Plainville Public Schools will have fully articulated a Tier 1 and Tier 2 system of supports that result in increased application of general education interventions and lower percentages of students requiring special education services.

Climate, Culture & Well-Being

Ensure all students, staff, and family members feel included, valued, and engaged as important members of the school community through the use of equitable and inclusive practices.

- 1. By June 30, 2028, the district will have developed and implemented programs and approaches that ensure equitable and inclusive practices, and where evidence demonstrates that students, staff, and family members feel included, valued, and engaged as important members of the school community.
- 2. By June 30, 2028, the Plainville Public Schools will have maximized the success of all students through the development and implementation of an MTSS model as measured by improved student feelings of belongingness and inclusion, as well as increased resources and approaches designated for mental health support.

Professional Development

Develop and implement a professional development plan that provides high-quality professional development opportunities for all staff members.

- 1. By June 30, 2028, the district will have a clearly articulated process for identifying professional development needs that will be fulfilled on an annual basis, inclusive of all areas of employment.
- 2. By June 30, 2028, the Plainville Public Schools will have increased the number of opportunities for educators to collaborate on common goals and instructional practices that will enhance student achievement.
- 3. By June 30, 2028, the Plainville Public Schools will have systemic opportunities for educators to refine their skills and more adeptly embed culturally responsive and equitable practices.

District Operations

Ensure a safe & secure learning & working environment for all by advocating for appropriate funding that will drive effective, efficient systems for all areas of operations districtwide (budget, facilities management, food services, human resources, technology infrastructure). The current safety committee will establish a common focus and measurable outcomes that ensure safe and secure schools.

- 1. By June 30, 2028, an effective and efficient system of district operations will be created and implemented in all areas of this objective. By June 30, 2028, we will streamline our hiring practices to fill open positions with diverse and highly skilled staff.
- 2. By June 30, 2028, the Plainville Public Schools will increase the amount of dedicated maintenance/facilities support.
- 3. By June 30, 2028, Plainville's schools will be further fortified with safety and security measures both in processes and buildings. Implementation of an enhanced physical security plan will be completed.
- 4. By June 30, 2028, the district will have completed the implementation of a comprehensive cyber security plan..
