To fund energy conservation measures including lighting improvements in the Anna Ware Jackson Elementary School and the Beatrice H. Wood Elementary School

- Competitive Grant Award
 - August 2019 \$250,000.00

To fund energy conservation measures, boiler replacement, weatherization, LED lighting and installation of a variable refrigerant flow system in the Anna Ware Jackson Elementary School and the Beatrice H. Wood Elementary School

Actions Completed:

- I. Replaced a low-efficiency boiler at the Beatrice H. Wood Elementary School with a high-efficiency boiler
- 2. Installed highly efficient LED lighting in the classrooms and offices in the A wing of the Anna Ware Jackson Elementary School
- 3. Properly weatherized the A and D wings in the Anna Ware Jackson Elementary School
- 4. Installed a new variable refrigerant heating/cooling split system in the A wing and a portion of the D wing in the Anna Ware Jackson Elementary School
