Counts to 100 by ones			
Counts to 100 by tens			
Counts forward beginning from a given number within the known sequence (instead of having to begin at 1)			
Writes numbers 0 – 20			
When counting objects, says the number names in the standard order, pairing each object with one and only one number name and each number name with one and only one object			
Understands that the last number name said tells the number of objects counted. The number of objects is the same regardless of their arrangement or the order in which they were counted (circle, line, and rectangular array)			
Understands that each successive number name refers to a quantity that is one larger			
Identifies whether the number of objects in one group is greater than, less than, or equal to the number of objects in another group			
Compares two numbers between 1 and 10 presented as written numerals			
Operations and Algebraic Thinking	T1	T2	T3
Represents addition and subtraction with objects, fingers, mental images, drawings, sounds (e.g., claps), acting out situations, verbal explanations, expressions, or equations			
Solves addition and subtraction word problems, and adds and subtracts within 10 by using objects or drawings to represent the problem			
Decomposes numbers less than or equal to 10 into pairs in more than one way by using objects or drawings, and records each decomposition by drawing or equation ($5 = 2 + 3$ and $5 = 4 + 1$)			
For any number from 1 to 9, finds the number that makes 10 when added to the given number			
Fluently adds and subtracts within 5			
Number and Operations in Base Ten	T1	T2	T3
Composes and decomposes numbers from 11 to 19 into ten ones and some further ones, by using objects or drawings, and records each composition or decomposition by drawing or equation (e.g., $18 = 10 + 8$)
