During Reading... (You will read this several times, each with a different focus.)

Reading 1 - Read the passage in your head. This time, get a gist for what the story is all about. Try to picture it in your head.

Reading 2 - Pay attention to the important ideas in each paragraph. Jot down a note in the margin - what happened in each paragraph?

**Reading 3 and 4** - Read the passage out loud. Each time try to improve your fluency.

- ✓ Summarize the story What happened first, next, and last?
- ✓ Would you like to try a Japanese lunch? Why or why not?
- 3. **Just for fun!** Read <u>Critter Crossings</u>. Opinion: Do you think states should build more critter crossings? Why or why not?
